<u>Three charities from North Yorkshire to be presented with the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service</u>

<u>The Lord-Lieutenant of North Yorkshire Mr Barry Dodd CBE</u> is to hold a very special presentation ceremony at Birdsall House, Malton by kind permission of Lord and Lady Middleton on **Thursday 22**nd **September** to present the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service.

The work of three groups in the community will be recognised and honoured with the highest national award a voluntary group can receive in the UK. **Ryedale Carers** is a voluntary organisation and registered charity that provides practical and emotional help for carers, the **Scarborough Maritime Heritage Centre** work to preserve the town's history, and **Ryedale Youth Centre** encourages and instructs young people in all aspects of the performing arts.

The Lord-Lieutenant, Mr Barry Dodd CBE said:

"These three organisations have excelled in serving their communities and I hope that their example will encourage people to nominate other groups from our county for this award. I look forward to meeting the groups personally on what will be a very special occasion".

The ceremony followed by a reception with drinks and canapes, will be attended by some of the winning groups trustees, volunteers and supporters.
